



R & R Flooring and Furniture was recently named Spencer Area Chamber of Commerce Business of the Year. Who better to tell you about the history of R & R but Perry Hinrichsen himself, owner and operator since its beginning in 2009. I sat down with Perry a couple Thursdays ago at his business at the corner of Hwy 13 and Depot Street.

"The break of my life". "We've been here for ten years now, "Perry started. "This building was built in 1980 and started out as Jerry's Lawn and Garden owned by Jerry Kobs. Later on it was The Greenery and then turned into a specialty clothing store owned by Paula Hanson. Paula gave me the break of my life when she sold me the building on a land contract in March 2009. She stayed in the front part of the store with her business and I had the middle portion. I bought 25 carpet remnants from Wick Building Systems of Marshfield when they closed their doors. I'd buy a carpet remnant and install it myself and that's how we got started."

"In 2010 Paula got out completely," continued Hinrichsen. "There was a consignment store up front for a year. I kept doing the same thing. I'd install when I could and the lady would watch the store for me. In 2011 Hwy.13 was closed. That was a tough year, especially just being the third year in business."

"Then it took off". "We didn't really start to get going 'till 2012. Then it took off. We worked out of three semi-trailers and this building. Cut carpet out on the black-top for the week in between rain drops and snow flakes. We added furniture that year as well as mattresses. We got in with Lang Furniture and later on Wolfcraft.

A good offensive line. "As we got going and grew, we added-on a few years ago, in 2016. A warehouse. 3600 sq. ft. And now that isn't big enough (he said with a chuckle). We've added Kip Lang as our Vice-President



and project manager. Ashley Stroetz is our store manager and designer. You might have a capable quarterback but it still takes a team effort, a good offensive line, everybody pulling together to get it done right. We've now been doing flooring statewide (see R & R on page 5).

both commercial and residential. We've gone from Manitowish Waters two weeks ago to Burlington, WI just 3 weeks ago. We've had as many as 7 sets of installers out of here in one day. Now we customize in tile showers. Our specialty showers are all tile, with heated floors, back splashes and stacked stone fireplaces. As for furniture; we have cabinet furniture, log furniture, camo furniture, if they're looking for specialty furniture. And we stock about 100 mattresses."

Work hard/together. " At one time I installed a lot of Menards' flooring for like five years. I worked two jobs for a while. At Wicks and then at night I'd install tile and carpet, stretch carpet. I also did that at Wick's and eventually learned a trade. It was tough. It's a tough job. These guys earn every penny they get for installing. We have a lot of good contacts now from contractors, plumbers, dry-wallers, etc. So there's a lot of us that work together and refer each other."

I'm glad I let Perry tell his own story. He did it way better than I could and it reinforced what I hope I already knew; hard work pays off; good things come to good people and it's always good to have a new warehouse so you don't have to cut carpet in the rain.
