Deb says that their group will see what they can improve and what they can do differently. She felt it was very well attended with 105 entries at the car show, 42 units in the parade, 40 kids at the pedal pull, a minitractor pull, the return of Miss Spencerama and great attendance at the Community Church Worship.

Deb said there were no negative incidents of any kind and as they move forward they will try to keep it manageable for our community and neighboring ones. She also wanted to thank all sponsors and donors. Besides, Spencerama 2019 will be June 7,8 +9. Just saying.

s promised in the last issue, I would give you more information on the Spencer PD and their on-going efforts to begin a K9 unit. What I found out was that I will be reporting on this in an on-going basis as there is a lot to tell.

For now I'll let Officer Mindy Stellmach fill you in on K9.

We are hoping to have the money raised by the end of this year in the hopes of having our K9 in 2019. If we don't have enough money raised by the end of the year, we will continue to fund-raise until we do have enough.

Our K9 will be used primarily for locating. A K9 can locate evidence, narcotics, lost children, lost elderly, and lost "bad guys". Apprehension bites could be used as a last resort when dealing with dangerous suspects. A K9 can search a building and locate suspects in a fraction of the time that it would take Officers to. Essentially, it's like having an additional, un-paid Officer on our department.

The community will continue to see us working hard to take dangerous drugs off the streets and keep them out of our schools. Once we have our K9 we would love to demonstrate what a K9 can do by giving presentations and demonstrations to our community members! I think a K9 can be a bridge between our community and our agency.

We have our 1st Annual Spencer Police Department K9 "Best Ball" Golf Scramble planned for Friday, August 3rd at River Edge Golf Course in Marshfield. The golf outgoing is \$80/individual or \$300/team and includes lunch, 18 holes of golf, golf cart, and awards. Registration forms can be picked up at the Police Department or Kwik Trip.

We have seen great community support so far, and we're very excited to see this department grow.

As a brief addendum, Officer Stellmach told me that they have received/raised up to \$30,000 already and that's just since February so they are well on their way to having another "Officer".


