Elle Sundell was a well-known and well -respected member of Spencer for as long as I can remember. She was a homemaker and worked in various clerical aide positions before retiring as secretary of the Spencer Public School System

She was married to John Day in August 1955. Day served as attorney for the Village of Spencer. Together they had five boys. In my recent conversation with Jim Day, who graduated a year ahead of me, I impressed myself by remembering the order in which they were born. John, Tom, Jim, Mike, and Jeff. Elle married Chuck Sundell in 1969 and had Kathy. All are pictured above in SKG'S new Elle's Kitchen, with some wives and a husband sprinkled in.

When their mother passed, the family tried to think of an appropriate way to honor her name. Spencer Kids Group Director Erica Schober told me that one day, Jim Day came to visit. A short time later the family called to say, "we'd like to re-model your kitchen for you." And with that Elle's Kitchen was born.

While Schober credited the Day/Sundell Family with donations far north of the \$20,000 figure printed in the TRG, Jim Day gave ample credit to Schober for taking the ball and running with it.

Third year Director at SKG, Schober may have felt as though she just won the lottery but Elle's Kitchen was still a ways away. The old kitchen harbored

some of its original equipment, complete with just a small fridge, two working burners on a worn –out stove and woefully incomplete storage space.

Schober went to work getting some contractors and some volunteers and other help to put in the brand new range, refrigerator and dishwasher, the new cabinets, backsplash and sink. The remodel included up-dates of electrical and plumbing problems and laminate flooring. Some new paint and other accoutrements, including an Elle's Kitchen sign in Elle's own script and the place was christened Elle's Kitchen with the ribbon cutting, which all the Day/Sundell family was able to attend, although they live all over the country.

Schober seemed tickled-pink as we toured her new kitchen. More Day/Sundell family donations, in the form of food, sat on the ample counter space as Schober told me that she feeds between 30-35 kids a day after school. When she took over the job she said she had no idea the need for some kids to have a snack or a meal during the day. Schober said the kids group meals come from local churches and donations. Christ the King Catholic Church gives SKG food from its community pantry and St. John's Lutheran and Trinity Lutheran buys things that Schober sometimes needs. Other donations come from people in the community. "When you're feeding thirty kids a day," Schober said, "this goes a long, long way.
