t a board meeting on Jan. 21st the school board approved a resolution to go to the voters on Tuesday, April 2nd to vote to approve a \$5.98 million project that will renovate the school building to improve safety and security; maintain, upgrade and equip facilities; and to construct and equip an addition to the school building for education, music and athletics.

Words cannot express how excited I am to share that information after a long deliberation which began about 3 years ago. With our initial thought of our current weight room as being unsafe because of the amount of weight on a wooden stage, we then put out a survey to the community. We asked for input on concepts and thoughts that would enable us to meet the current and future needs of our district along with working hard to create a facility that would attract new families to our community. That work is over; or better put, the work is just beginning.

I am extremely proud of the leadership and work our School Board has shown through this process. They have taken the information from a community survey, and have identified needs that will benefit our students and community for years to come.

Our next step of this process is to educate all stakeholders and to answer any questions that may come up. We are in the planning stages of setting dates for these sessions so please keep an eye out for them. I also anticipate putting out information on our webpage and Facebook outlets.
