

The R.J Tack Auditorium was built in 1957, four years before I arrived. It's a wonderful building to this day. I was never a good math student. Mrs. Ehrike or Della Fobes could've attested to that, or one of the Mr. Christensen's. I do know that was 62 years ago.

The previous high school was leveled by a ball and crane in the mid to late 60's as best as I can recollect. It was south of the current school where the elementary playground sits, on the east end.

One thing for sure, the bricks from that building ended up in the village junk yard (where the ARC Park is today) in between the railroad tracks and right across the street from our house. SCORE! We built some cool stuff with many and chucked many more in the marsh.

I could hardly contain my excitement when Mike Endreas sent me his "What's Rockin' in Rocketville" today and I saw the picture of the proposed addition to our school. I'll bet I could make a basket in there whether there was a net or not. What started as a re-vamped weight area and an addition to home ec and music/choral areas has evolved into a community survey that showed people wanted, not only all of the above, but additional physical education space, more extra-curricular space....and then some. And that was a couple years ago.

I went to school with some of the school board members and I coached the youngest one. Their energy for this project impressed me as they poured over statistics from different agencies and survey groups. They began to look for ways to get the village what they wanted. They worked with the local government and the federal government. They've tried to make it easier for all of us.

Some will say they've paid enough. Can't argue with that. Some will say they have no kids in school. True that. Sadly, neither do my wife and I anymore. Some will say they need the money for their retirement or families. I believe them. I want to invest in this town, my hometown, the way I invested in my adopted hometowns, two of them, when I made my living away from Spencer, whether it was monetarily, or the time that I spent with the youth, sometimes getting paid, sometimes not.

Old SHS and the elementary (which pre-dates the R.J. Tack auditorium) are hanging in there. They look quite similar to when I graduated in 1979 or when I moved back home in 2004. They've been repaired and up-dated and held up well. It's what we will have. And, of course, the additions are way past due and inevitable at some point. Nostalgia's kinda cool but the future is where it's at no matter how old you are. The future's now. Sometimes you gotta add on because the marsh can't hold any more bricks.
