So, if you received your brochure and have decided which shows you want to attend, you should be able to hop right on to the website and choose your seats, right? HOLD UP THERE, BUCKO! That's not quite how it works! SOME folks CAN hop right online and buy their tickets. These are the SEASON TICKET holders who have a three-week window to renew their season tickets before seats to single events can go on sale.

How do I get season tickets, you might well ask. It's easy! There are seven events in the LuCille's Vision Series. Choose to purchase tickets to at least FIVE of them. Then select your preferred seat location, subtract your ten percent discount, pay for and print your tickets. You get to keep the same seats for every show and you have first dibs at renewing your season tickets NEXT year! There are a few other little perks, as well, but we won't discuss them here. A U-12 baseball tournament, horseshoe tournament, and the return of the Trailblazer vintage campers are also a part of the weekend festivities in Spencer.





Referendum Passes...

S pencer voters went to the polls on April 2nd and voted 781-598 to allow the school district to begin to renovate, improve safety and security and add a new dome structure for education, music and athletics. The project was for \$5.9 million but could be off-set by the possibility of FEMA grant dollars that the district will learn about in early May.

"I think it's a huge indicator of the work that the board has gone through," stated District Administrator Mike Endreas. "This process started three years

ago. They (the board) put out surveys, captured ideas from stakeholders and got ideas from many different groups to see what was best for our school district. Page 5



VILLAGE OF SPENCER DISTRICT WINS SAFETY AWARD

PLOVER, WI - The Wisconsin Rural Water Association (WRWA) recently held its Annual Technical Conference in La Crosse, Wisconsin where over 1,200 water system and industry personnel met for four days exchanging ideas and technology through technical training sessions and exhibits.

At this event each year the association presents awards to those in the public water treatment & conservation industries that have shown excellence in areas of utility management, operations and customer service. One of these areas is workplace safety, and the winner of the 2019 WRWA Safety Award was the Village of Spencer, Spencer WI.

"Working in the public utility industries is a dangerous occupation, especially in the weather conditions we experience here in Wisconsin" said WRWA Executive Director Chris Groh, "We're honored to recognize communities like the Village of Spencer that are committed to maintaining a safe workplace for all their municipal employees while at the same time providing excellent services to their customers."
