William Ackerman founded Windham Hill Records in Palo Alto in 1975. The label's recordings were a runaway success with critics and audiences alike. Musicians including Ackermann, Higbie, George Winston, Alex de Grassi and Liz Story quickly became internationally recognized and the name "Windham Hill" became synonymous with the best in acoustic music in the 1980's and 90's. The ten WINTER SOLSTICE compilation CD's, selling in the many millions, changed people's conceptions of seasonal music. Indeed, for many of your friends and neighbors, the recordings of WINTER SOLSTICE are played from



In other words....The Golden Rule...Treat others as you want to be treated.

What's so great about respect anyway? Why does it matter in the grand scheme of things? By definition, **respect** means to demonstrate "high regard" for or special attention to something or someone.

Being respected by important people in our lives growing up teaches us how to be respectful toward others. We learn to accept others for who they are, even when they're different from us or we don't agree with their opinion.

The key here is to stop focusing on you, and start thinking and caring about others. Every person you meet can teach you something. Pay attention to your surroundings and the people in your life. Sometimes you need to stop talking and listen. Genuinely listen to people and try to understand them. Every person has something unique to offer to the world, and that includes you.

Showing respect to others can be done in different ways. When meeting someone new, shaking hands is a sign of respect. When someone is talking to you, make good eye contact with them to show you are truly listening to them. When you pass by someone say Hello. Hold the door open for the person behind you. Be quiet in a library. Walking around, rather than through, someone's yard. Treat people with courtesy, politeness, and kindness.

One easy way to know whether you are being respectful is to simply ask yourself this question: "How will what I am about to say or do make that person or others feel? Will it create a positive reaction, or will it embarrass or possibly lower the esteem of the other person?"
