WELCOME COME


The Santa parade sponsored by the Spencer Area Chamber of Commerce was a great success.

at the TACK IV ell, friends, 2020 was quite a year, truly unforgettable in so very many ways.

While there has been no shortage of disappointments and setbacks, the Tack organization can still lay claim to plenty of positive accomplishments. Take an amble down memory lane with us.

Way, way back in January a handful of volunteers and donors put together a stage set for the performance of 3 Redneck Tenors. The "tenors" LOVED the set and we were able to cut a significant amount off the artist fee since we didn't need to rent their set. It was GREAT fun, and the audience got a kick out it!

In an effort to offer adults a creative outlet, Spencer Schools art instructor and member of the LTCA Board of Directors, Carmen Schweiger, began monthly "Art Nights." Needle felting and adult coloring managed to take place before the pandemic forced a pause. Stay tuned for the return of Art Night in 2021.

After the pandemic eliminated the remaining events in the Tack's 2019-20 season, many patrons and friends joined in contributing to a one-time "Full House Fundraiser" that netted more than \$3,000 and helped offset the significant drop in revenue the Tack was experiencing at the time. It goes without saying that this reassuring gesture helped us weather the storm.

With so many changes to the usual way of doing business, the board decided to take the opportunity to refresh the look of its season brochure, which had changed very little in the last 25 years. Stephanie Schauer at QuikPrint jumped to the challenge and updated the brochure with a smaller and a one-event-per-page format. We like how it turned out and have adopted the design for future editions.

In June, the Tack was fortunate to receive a grant from the Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin to help update the Gallery. R & R Flooring was instrumental in re-covering the walls and a start was made on a "permanent collection" of artwork that will be in place during the summer months and at any time the space is without a designated exhibit.

All through the pandemic, the Tack organization has been constantly considering what must be done to make the theatre a safe place to gather. Once COVID numbers have dropped significantly and vaccines have been distributed to many, revisions will be made with the hope that we will finally be able to gather in numbers to enjoy the Arts together.

Our volunteers are an outstanding group of individuals who know how to make things happen. Even though they weren't doing their usual tasks, "Tack Forces" accepted challenges to reach out to our community. During the first "Safer at Home" period, a team made ROCKIN' from page 1

came in way over budget.

In discussion with vendors there was confusion and many questions. At the District's request the contractors went back to the drawing board and through the design process and changes made to the clarity of the bid packets we feel good that we will be back on track. The new bids will be approved in February and the overall timeline of the project will be set for a completion date to start the 2021-22 school year.

The School Board has also been in discussion regarding our current revenue cap exemptions the voters approved five years ago in the amount of \$975,000. This sunsets at the end of the current school year. The board is reviewing budget forecast models and are deliberating to formulate a plan to ask the community for their financial support once again. The final resolution needs to be approved by January 26 and once that is determined we will have listening sessions to inform the community of the plan moving forward.

I am excited about not only the future of our School District but the community of Spencer as a whole. The village board has created opportunities for more homes and businesses to come to Spencer which can only be better for all in the long run. I hope you take some time to look back on 2020 and, like me, realize it has created perspective as to what is truly important in life. Once again Happy New Year!




TACK from page 5 nearly one hundred phone calls to community members, checking in to be sure they were doing OK and had what they needed. As school began, another team stitched nearly two hundred instrument bell covers so that Spencer band students could continue making music in small, socially-distanced groups. Giving back is so important!

As the calendar page turned to September, the Tack learned that our software program used to sell tickets online and in the box office was being discontinued. Remember that COVID has impacted ALL parts of the arts and entertainment industry. This failure hit very close to home! Within six weeks, research had been completed, training started and data migrated to new software. Though the transition is not yet fully complete, it has gone pretty well.

And finally, the Tack is beyond grateful to Governor Tony Evers for directing COVID relief to Wisconsin's cultural organizations and the live music and entertainment industry. Through a competitive grant process, the Lu-Cille Tack Center for the Arts received more than \$37,000 in aid which replaces a portion of revenue lost over the past nine months and helps pave the way to recovery in 2021.

While 2020 was not the happiest, the Tack Center organization appreciates the continued patronage and rock-solid support of the com-

munity in Central Wisconsin. Knowthat friends and family have vour back, even when you haven't them seen months, we are certain that because of YOU the show will INDEED go on! Thank you for all you do and best wishes for good health and happiness in 2021.


