I borrowed those four words from Spencer School District Administrator Mike Endreas' monthly column for the Village Voice. You can read them again within this newsletter. Evidence of that came on September 2, when the Spencer School District , in conjunction with the Village of Spencer and several members of the Spencer Area Chamber of Commerce hosted a ceremonial groundbreaking. The ceremony kicked off probably the biggest construction project to ever take place in the village. A project that will not only have a huge impact on the school districts' future but the future of the village itself.

Everyone knows the story by now but it's worth being redundant in this case. We, the voters, approved during a referendum vote, to move ahead on a \$5.98 million project that would build a new gymnasium, add needed areas for the music program, build a community fitness center, renovate the existing Family and Consumer Education Classroom, relocate the elementary office, to name just a few.

To say that it was an encouraging sign to see the referendum pass without the promise of rumored funding from the federal government would be an understatement. That rumored funding was because the school district did some "outside-the-box" thinking when it partnered with the Village to apply for a FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant.

FEMA? Pre-Disaster? What's that got to do with a gym and a re-vamped home ec room? Remember that "outside-the-box" thinking? Our school board found out that FEMA had occasionally offered funds to help com-



munities build emergency storm shelters. Could this be the proverbial killing of two birds with one stone?

Over a year after the April referendum vote FEMA announced it would indeed kick in some aid. Certainly not the \$2.4 million that seemed the top end of a pipe dream but \$2.9 million that would pick up nearly 90% of the total cost of the dome and its contents. I can't print my whole reaction in this familyfriendly newsletter. I'll leave it at !!! WOW!!!


Spencer PD now has a "sharps" container drop-box next to the prescription medication drop-box in the lobby of the Police Department!

According to the Marathon County Health Department, basic guidance is to put sharps in a commercial sharps disposal container on sale at most pharmacies or in a heavy plastic detergent or bleach bottle with a screw-on cap for sealing tightly. No milk jugs or other thin plastic. Do not separate the needle from the syringe. Label the container with "biohazard," "infectious waste," or "sharps."

 $^{\mathbf{v}}$ he school year is off and running and all I can say is that it has been anything but normal but it sure is nice to have the kids back and in the building. I am extremely proud of the work that our staff has done to accommodate the needs of our

kids. We have made many alterations to the way we normally do things and with work we are finally hitting our groove. I would also like to thank our School Board for supporting the work and planning of administration to do our best to reduce risk for our students. Our school district has been labeled as taking a conservative approach to the pandemic. I am proud of that distinction. Albeit not the popular choice in many people's eyes, we are assuring that when we have a positive case we will affect a minimal amount of students. Scenarios of districts having to quarantine 100 students and staff applied to our school would have meant three kids. I appreciate your patience in this matter as we continually work with the Marathon County Health department in trying to expand our schedule and offerings.

I am happy to announce that our cross-country team has been getting the opportunity to compete. Volleyball and football seasons have started and contests began at the end of September. Due to conference rules we are limited in the number of fans. Our current practice is to allow 2 fans per athlete for indoor sports (volleyball) and 4 fans per athlete for outdoor (football). There are no limitations on fans for cross-country. Due to this limit we will be live-streaming all of our varsity contests and the majority of our non-varsity levels. Keep an eye on our Facebook page for more information.

Things are getting real with our building project. The footings for the dome were dug in late September and we anticipate the building project to be enclosed before serious winter hits. The interior work will take place throughout the winter months with an expected finish date of early to mid-summer 2021. If you wish to track the progress of the project we have a time-lapse camera archiving the progress on our school web page and we also look to post updated pictures on our school Facebook page.

At our September meeting the board chose to extend the requirement to wear masks through the end of the first quarter. The kids have done an outstanding job of wearing masks and adhering to our expectations. As a district we want to continue to do our part for our community to put an end to this pandemic. The recommendation of our health professionals has been our guiding principal from day one and we will continue on the route as we feel it is in the best interest of our students, staff and community.
