**ave** you ever heard of "The 5 Love Languages?" Back in 1992, marriage counselor Gary Chapman identified five ways that people express and receive love: Words of Affirmation, Quality Time, Receiving Gifts, Acts of Service, and Physical Touch. Without hesitation, they dropped whatever was going on in their life to offer assistance and get the job completed. The Tack has been a grateful recipient of this love

and, though it is doubtful that ANY of these kind souls wish to be acknowledged in this public way, it must be done. Their acts of service have made a challenging time much easier and a great deal less stressful than would have been if completed by a single, solitary person.

he Spencer Area Historical Society has planned "A Discovery Walk" on Memorial Day, May 31, 2021.

Tours will run continuously starting at 11:00AM until 2:00PM 117 E. Clark Str. Spencer Olde Hall at the West Spencer Cemetery on Highway 98. In case of rain this event will be held in the Kid's Group Hall on Clark Street.

Re-enactors will tell stories of pioneers at each of the grave sites of:

Ritzpah Crowell, a Brothertown Native American. She was a school teacher and local actress who did extensive volunteer work at King's Veteran Home.

Laurence Driscoll was the first rural mail carrier on Route #1 when that service first started. He later became postmaster. The last saw mill to be built in town was the Driscoll, Andrews, Colby Mill erected in the late 1890's or early 1900's on the east side of Hwy. 13 near the site where R & R Flooring and Furniture sits today.

Guy Ingham was an award-winning fur farmer, jeweler, early radio electronics dealer, ginseng grower, and a pilot with his own airport.

Karl Stoltenow opened a brickyard in 1887 where the presentday Ponderosa apartments are located. It produced 200,000 bricks annually. He also operated a farm supply store and tavern.

Twins Ward and Wesley Vanderhoof were both in the Civil war. Wesley boasted of having shook Abe Lincoln's hand. Both men were later farmers with large tracts of land in the town of Sherman.
