

WORLD CHAMPS

I'll do my best.

On April 30th in 1971, the Bucks beat the Baltimore Bullets to sweep the seven game series 4-0 to become the fastest true expansion team in the history of North American sports to win a championship in just their third year of existence. 182 days later I celebrated my 10th birthday.

You see, the Bucks were established in 1968 after having lost their first venture into the National Basketball Association when the Hawks packed up and left for St. Louis in 1955 after four seasons in Milwaukee.

That '71 team, of which I recorded each game into a notebook as we listened on the radio, had some basketball royalty, with Lew Alcindor (The Big A), later to be known as Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Oscar Robertson (The Big O). They steamrolled the Bullets in the finals after dispatching the Western Conference fairly easily, recording a franchise record that still stands at 66-16.

Fan is short for fanatic and I plead guilty. I've bled Buck forest-green, Packer green and gold and Brewer blue and yellow since I can remember. There's plenty of folks who come around when they win. I tend to agonize some as well. I'll blame genetics in a good way.

So, when our World Champion Milwaukee Bucks started making some noise this season picking up the third seed in the Eastern Conference, dispatching last seasons Eastern champs Miami in four games, kicking the Hawks to the curb in six games, toying with the Nets, letting them win a couple before showing them the door, I was already firmly planted in my lay-z-boy. Then I sat up on the edge and waited for the Suns.

After coaching hoops for over three decades and watching it over five, I thought I'd seen it all. I hadn't.

I said agonize earlier? Add in a little torment, anguish and some worry, fret and fuss, plus a two game deficit, only to return to Milwaukee and replace it with glee and happiness when we tied it at two at home. Throw in jubilance when we took a 3-2 lead out in the desert and euphoria when we downed the Suns in six just a few days later.

This time the cast included a Greek Freak, Giannis Antetokounmpo, a former D-League player, Kris Middleton, a brand new point guard in Jrue Holiday, a gave-up-upon center, Brook Lopez and guys named Bobby P., PJ, and Pat, (who used to pitch at Notre Dame.)

Antetokounmpo stamped his ticket as one of the finest performers in finals history with a 50 point, 14 rebound performance that included a 17 for 19 free throw performance that had previously been his Achilles heel.

Not many had predicted the Bucks to win it all and I won't say whether I did, but if you didn't sit on the edge of your lay-z-boy for a bit, I feel sorry for ya. It was great.

Oh, and in 101 days from July 20, I'll be 60 years old. I'll consider it an early birthday present. Thanks Bucks! Best present I ever had!

at the TACK It was an August that began like most others and which suddenly transformed into a technicolor dream no

one could have predicted. It was in August 1994 that Spencer Schools learned of a bequest to the district from life-long philanthropist and Spencer native, LuCille Tack. LuCille had left \$450,000 of her estate to be used by the school to either update the library or build an arts center. The school board opted for the arts center and managed to get a referendum on the November ballot requesting an additional sum of \$225,000 from local taxpayers. With a 74% affirmative vote, the project was underway.

Eau Claire construction and design firm, Professional Management Services Inc., was given the go-ahead to begin work and a group of neophyte but passionate individuals stepped forward to help plan both the facility and the organization that would oversee it. This steering committee made up of businesspeople, art enthusiasts, educators and others, had much to do before ground was broken in May 1995. Divided into interest groups they mulled over the priorities and expectations this theater would have, toured venues around Wisconsin to educate themselves on how to best build a facility that would allow for these priorities and expectations and, when necessary, made the difficult choices that most building projects eventually must confront – those of cost and budget.

Once the construction was underway, the steering committee sought assistance from the Wisconsin Arts Board, who shepherded them through the challenges of organizing a local arts board – diversity of membership and talents, a mission, bylaws and strategic planning. What then became the non-profit organization known as LuCille Tack Center for the Arts and its first president, Linda Bauer, began preparing for its first season as a presenting arts venue. New committees were formed, and a grand opening celebration with headliner Lorie Line and her Pop Chamber Orchestra, a morning fun run/walk, entertainment from within the community, a sit-down dinner and a post-concert reception were planned for October 12, 1996. ALL were a resounding success!

While some members of the first board of directors expected only a modest number of events per season, the inaugural program included seven, some of which were also offered to students during

the school day, the first Arts Adventure Series! Few of the volunteers had any experience in presenting professional performers on stage, reserved seating and ticketing, sound and lighting skills, contract negotiations and the like. It was learn-as-you-go, and both board members and volunteers were frequently heard stating that, "We're young and just getting started. Can you help us with this?"
