From the standpoint of the district our maintenance and custodial staff are tearing apart the building, cleaning it, and putting it back together. This may seem pretty basic but couple that with classes going on and having to work around various other activities, we are truly blessed to have such an amazing staff provided to us through Dashir management services.

On the School Board level they, will finish up this

year's budget and look to approve the budget at our annual meeting in August. Time will be taken in July to discuss the goals for the upcoming school year as well.
