ROCKIN' from page 1 forward we are going to monitor and keep in tune with our data and allow that

to direct us in our planning. To start the school year the school board has approved a plan that:

• Masks will be recommended but not required. ● Social Distancing whenever possible. ● Vaccinated individuals will not be required to quarantine. ● Non-vaccinated exposed individuals will be allowed to attend with no symptoms and a negative result of a Covid Test. ● Covid positive individuals will follow the 10 day quarantine and return symptom free. ● Athletics will follow the WIAA guidelines (which may differ from District plan)

As mentioned, we will monitor and track positive cases and if we reach a threshold of 5% of our population positive we will begin mitigation measures such as masking and further precautions.

On a more positive note all of our Fall sports are up and running full blast. It is great to see our kids getting the opportunities to play and participate as we all know that is what school is all about.

Lastly, an update on our building project. I was told I would have the keys handed over the week of September 20 for occupancy. We look to use that week to move in and begin classes and general school usage. The current issue is the timeline for the bleacher install. I am told that anything involving steel is delayed and difficult to get. I am hoping to get an athletic contest in our gym this fall yet but time will tell. I do anticipate opening the fitness center to our community sometime in October.



Hope all is well with everyone. I look forward to working with the students, staff and community to have an outstanding school year. One last quick please; be on the lookout for bus traffic beginning Sept. 1!

Well-known for both her English teaching career and theatre legacy, the late Esther Rannow was also one of the LTCA's first volunteers and its House Manager for many years. In celebration of the Tack's 10th Anniversary in 2006-07, Mrs Rannow wrote a series of articles for the TRG's "Backstage at the Tack," in which were shared memories of each of its past ten seasons. The Village Voice is republishing these articles to offer the reader a glimpse backward into the Tack's history.

I know. It doesn't seem possible the LuCille Tack Center for the Arts in Spencer is celebrating its tenth anniversary. As with any anniversary, it becomes a time for reminiscing and remembering. Those volunteers at LTCA have a host of moments that they recall and some were even willing to share them. A particularly poignant perspective came from volunteer Marcia Draeger. She had been attending the earliest planning stages of the Tack center, and

after construction had begun, Larry Stordahl, District Administrator, took the members of the committee to check out the progress. It was November, dark and cold, when he led them to the area that would become the stage. She said, "As I looked up and saw the open, dark sky with many stars....it was beautiful. I thought, this will never be seen again, just like this." Apparently, Diane Veale felt the same way and brought her choral group to the stage where they sang under the open ceiling.

That first season at the Tack brought to the stage an incredible variety of performers: from the Russian Folk Orchestra, Ballet Folklorico de Mexico, Jury's Irish Cabaret and The Madison Brass, Riders in the Sky to The Howie Sturtz Orchestra and Granny. For many audience members, however, the shining moment was Lorie Line and her Pops Chamber Orchestra at the Grand Opening of the LTCA.

It was her appearance, in fact that enticed some of the Tack's most ardent volunteers and supporters. Russ and Nancy Dean from Greenwood wrote that they hadn't heard anything about the Tack Center in 1996, but when Russ' mother came to visit and read about the upcoming show, she wanted to go. Said she used to listen to Line playing at Dayton's in downtown Minneapolis. Nancy said, "So we got the tickets...the last three, I think, as were in the back row. Anyway, we really enjoyed the concert and were hooked from then on. We've never heard a bad concert at the Tack!" Amen to that! One of the wonderful aspects of the Tack, is its "Front Porch Series" that brings to the stage, and our audiences, a wonderful opportunity for more local and regional performers. That first season began what I believe is a valuable dimension to its programming. Sally Rakovec wrote

this: "I'd just like to say a few words about Phyllis and Larry Huber (Country Folk). How proud to have these folks that grew up right here in Spencer, graduated from Spencer High, were high school sweethearts, and have such talent. When they performed at the LTCA for this first time, it was also about the time they were visiting Nashville for a recording session. They really make music together; they harmonize so beautifully." I concur, being only mildly biased since both had been students in my classes.

Grand openings are nearly always exciting, and certainly that day and evening at the Tack was no exception. Mingled with the excitement, however, was no small amount of anxiety. For those people who had spent countless LuCille Tack hours planning and preparing for this day, there were also questions: Will this work? Have we done enough? Can Center we make it go? Will it survive? Well, I guess we know the answers to those questions, don't we? In ten years, the LTCA has grown into a respected member of the artistic community in Wisconsin. LuCille's Vision has become a solid reality that makes us proud. We remain ever grateful for her gift and for the extraordinary efforts of this community to keep it growing.


