

Well-known for both her English teaching career and theatre legacy, the late Esther Rannow was also one of the LTCA's first volunteers and its House Manager for many years. In celebration of the Tack's 10th Anniversary in 2006-07, Mrs Rannow wrote a series of articles for the TRG's "Backstage at the Tack," in which were shared memories of each of its past ten seasons. The Village Voice is re-publishing these articles to offer the reader a glimpse backward into the Tack's history.

The season brochure from the LuCille Tack Center for the Arts offered eleven shows for the 1999 – 2000 season! Not too bad for an upstart theater. This was, after all, only its fourth season. Once again, it displayed a wide variety of affordable entertainment.

Of particular interest to our local audiences is the Our Front Porch series at the Tack which provides a venue for local performers and artists. So much outstanding talent we have in our own backyard! The Community Collage this season included the Atomic Tailfins from Marshfield and the Wayward Scandinavians from the Greenwood area. What a delightful contrast in music and styles and the audience loved them! The Atomic Tailfins would return the following season to perform a full evening of rock 'n' roll music and dancing sponsored by the LTCA.



The season also marked the first appearance of Gaelic Storm. This group, which first gained national attention with its appearance in the film The Titanic, certainly took the Tack audience by storm. The energy and skill of the performers made such an impact on the audience that they would be invited to return in 2004 (at much greater cost)!

Volunteer Sally Rakovec recalls something else about this outstanding group. "I remember the first time we had Gaelic Storm at the Tack Center. Usually, artists have specific food items that they want. Sometimes they have a vegetarian or they like a certain tea."

"Well, Gaelic Storm said they wanted cider. So I got a couple half gallons of apple cider. I, being from the Midwest, knew of no other cider. Well, they wanted dark cider beer, which we cannot supply."

"They thought it was so funny that they got apple cider they even brought it on stage with them. If there was a song about any kind of drinking, they pointed directly to the 'apple' cider right out front. When they came back the second time, they jokingly asked where the apple cider was. "

"I think the best times spent with any group are when we feed them. They are hungry and we fill a need. They always seem to relax with food as it is a common ground. We have many laughs and stories as we eat together."

While it's true that I've never seen a bad performance at the Tack, like everyone else, I have my own personal favorites. Two of them appeared during this season. Blind Man's Bluff, a group of five young men who not only sang a cappella but also made astonishing mouth sounds. I love good a cappella groups, and this one was outstanding. Also outstanding was the appearance of the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra. It's wonderful listening to excellent musicians do what they do so well.

Attending shows at the LuCille Tack Center for the Arts gives us that opportunity several times throughout the year. Whatever your favorite, you'll find it there – waiting to entertain you.

Spencer Library news....

December 1-31 children may pick up their free Grab N Go craft at the Spencer Library. Go under the sea by making your own craft aquarium. Weave waves of the ocean with yarn, and then color and paste sea creatures in the waves to create your own sea scene. All supplies and instructions are included.

December 1-31 adults and teens may pick up their Grab N Go craft, "I Love Books" wooden heart. You will get a wooden heart pendant declaring your love for books that can be used as an ornament, gift tag, attached to a bookmark or in some other creative way. These kits are free and available to the public. One kit per person while supplies last.

Starting Nov. 29th, 2021 there will be a checkout policy change in all the Marathon County Libraries. (Non -new) Books, Audiobooks & Playaways will now be a 21 day checkout period (former policy was 28 days). Magazines 7 days checkout period (former was 14 days). Renewal Periods are equal to the items checkout period (former renewal period was 7 or 14 days). \$5 fine limit (former was \$10).




